- (b) Critically assess the view that whereas religious authority was of central importance in the Celtic Church, it is of no importance today. [30]
- 2** (a) Discuss the development of missionary outreach of the Celtic Church to Northern Britain. [20]
- (b) “The Celtic Church had no doubts about its missionary aims whereas the Christian Church today is unsure.”
- Critically evaluate this claim. [30]
- 3** (a) Analyse the teaching of Vatican II on the nature of Church organisation. [20]
- (b) “Change has not always been welcome but is an essential feature of church life.”
- Critically assess this claim in relation to the Celtic Church and the Protestant Reformation. [30]
