This meant that the will of the people was upheld.

**Read Source B and answer the question that follows.**

**Source B:**

The Single Transferable Vote (STV) is a form of Proportional Representation (PR). It is the system of voting used to elect MLAs to the Northern Ireland Assembly. In 2022, Sinn Féin won the most seats in the Assembly elections, with the Democratic Unionist Party just two seats behind them. Some say that STV is an undesirable electoral system as it can lead to instability and coalition governments.

**Source C:**

**‘Just Stop Oil’** is an environmental pressure group which has gained a lot of media attention. Their protests have included pitch invasions at several Premier League football grounds and interrupting play at Wimbledon. The group says it is committed to ending its protests as soon as the British government agrees to end its use of fossil fuels.
